ENTRANCE ANTIPHON *Cf. Ps 98 (97): 1-2*

Cantate Domino canticum novum

Roman Missal: O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

Roman Gradual: Sing to the Lord a new song, alleluia; for the Lord has accomplished wondrous deeds, alleluia; he has revealed his justice in the sight of the Gentiles, alleluia, alleluia.

These antiphons basically match, but I included the Gradual one to show where all the extra alleluias and the verse come from.

Ant. O sing a new song to the Lord, all you on earth with one accord. God has made his salvation known; His saving mercy he has shown.

Vs. God's holy arm has won the fight; God has revealed his strength and might! All corners of the earth have seen the justice of our God and King.

Vs 2. O sing to God with harp and song, with trumpets now the praise prolong! Sing in your joy before the King; let all the heav'ns with praises ring!

Dox. Praise to the Father and the Son, who has for us redemption won! Praise to the Spirit, with them one, together while the ages run.
